> now.
> One of my main points has been that the two proposed structures would only

> Giarusso had said they need a 1000 beds. If the nanotech center is to
> expand, it's inevitable that Freedom Quad will be wiped out. In that case
> they may need even more beds on the east side of the campus. Whatever way
> you look at this, the UAlbany planners are being short-sighted. As I said
> at
> Tuesday's meeting, where is the leadership??

> UAlbany is the only SUNY campus that did not grow this year. (Supposedly
> that was deliberate because they wanted to rehab some housing space.)
> However, whenever the economy tanks, enrollments go up. UAlbany can and
> should grow. In that light, building dorms for even 1000 students is still
> not realistic. They will be planning for additional growth before these
> dorms could be constructed.

> My entire argument has been for a comprehensive, long-term plan.
