**Some neighborhood news.** The Strassburg home site, 1 McKown Road, is to be repartitioned into four lots. The Planning Board Hearing on this proposal is February 14, 7:30pm at Town Hall. The Tusang-Barhydt building, 1434 Western Avenue, next to Germano's garage, is again occupied. The Albany County Veterinarian office, 1506 Western Avenue, has a new owner. The Denny's building, 1512 Western Avenue, continues to be vacant. Starbucks, 1246 Western Avenue, has been open for several months now. The Capital Lodge Motel, 1230 Western Avenue, is now a Days Inn and has been much improved in appearance. The Holiday Inn Express added some attractive new features to its building. The NanoTech campus has a new natural gas line. It has removed the old maintenance building. The Harriman campus has received budget approval for \$7.5 million for roadway construction. The reconstruction of Schoolhouse Road/Russell Road is to be completed by the County this year. And the new sidewalks along Western Avenue and McKown Road will be built this year.

But the greatest news is that **Supervisor Ken Runion** announced on December 19, 2006 that the Town had received a grant from the State for making the McKownville Reservoir into a more usable park. This has been long awaited. A pond to walk around, a place to sit on a bench, read a newspaper, enjoy a cup of coffee, eat a sandwich, have a chat with a friend, but in general find some outdoor relaxation. A colonial village had its village green—we will have our **McKownville Reservoir Park**. Thank you Mr. Runion.
